

**Christian Crowder, PhD, D-ABFA** received his BA from Texas A&M University, MA from the University of Texas at Arlington, and PhD from the University of Toronto. He is currently Director of the Forensic Anthropology Division for the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences in Houston, Texas. Previously he was the chief anthropologist for the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner, which is the center of medical-legal investigations for the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System (AFMES). Working closely with investigative arms of the branches of the military, forensic investigation of crime scenes were conducted world-wide. Prior to accepting the position with AFMES, Dr. Crowder was Deputy Director of Forensic Anthropology Unit for the Office of Chief Medical Examiner – New York City. Dr. Crowder has also worked as an anthropologist for the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency formally known as the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command Central Identification Laboratory (JPAC-CIL) in Hawaii and the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia. In addition to his practitioner duties, Dr. Crowder is adjunct faculty at Pace University in New York City and at the University of Toronto, Ontario.
